

Three years ago, Helen and I were discerning the possibility of becoming overseas missionaries. By December we began the application processes with the Camboni Missionaries, and for Christmas, the kids got the news of our decision. We were definitely on our way to Uganda or Peru, and we were excited about this new adventure. Then life happened and we discovered that, at least for the time being, our mission was not in South America or Africa, it was here helping with a critical family need.

Today we celebrate World Missionary Sunday. In St. Luke's Gospel, we read that Jesus sends out 72 disciples in pairs of two with instructions to preach the Word, heal the sick, and offer up blessings (Lk 10:1-10). At the end of St. Matthew's Gospel Jesus imparts to the disciples the Great Commission; to go out and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and the Holy Spirit (Mt 28:16-20). These two great stories serve as examples of Jesus' intention for his church to be a missionary church. After all, how else are the seeds of the faith sown?

Sisters and brothers, today we are reminded that through our baptism we, like Paul and the other disciples, are given the mandate of being missionary disciples. Today we are called to recommit ourselves to this common vocation as missionary disciples through prayer, participation in the Eucharistic mystery, service, and other acts of charity.

The importance of supporting, and even serving in overseas missionary work cannot be overemphasized, but it is important we also realize that not all missionary work is international. Often time it is right here in our community and our own family. I pray you are generous in supporting international missionary work, and if you feel called to such work, I urge you to pursue and discern this calling.

The truth is most are not called to be missionaries in a foreign land, but we are all called to preach the Gospel where we are planted. We are all called to live our faith in love and service to the least among us in our own communities. For some that will be through direct action, such as volunteering at one of our homeless shelters or soup kitchens. For others, missionary activity may be through financial contribution which makes the other work possible. Of course, for all of us, missionary work can not be separated from the act of prayer and sharing our faith with others.

Helen and I have not abandoned our dream of serving in the mission fields but in the meantime, we must grow where God has planted us. I encourage you to also grow where God has planted you and to ask yourself, better yet ask God, how you can be the missionary disciple he wants you to be. — Deacon Ken
