He Couldn't Fight, Either: One day a truck driver stopped at a restaurant for dinner and ordered a steak. Before he could eat it, in walked a motorcycle gang, with dirty leather jackets and long, unkempt hair. They took the man's steak, cut it into six pieces, and ate it. The driver said nothing. He simply paid the bill and walked out. One of the gang members said, "That man couldn't talk. He didn't say a word." Another one said, "He couldn't fight, either; he didn't lift a hand." A waiter added, "I would say that he couldn't drive either. On his way out of the parking lot, he ran over six motorcycles crushing all of them." Something in us loves that story, because we like retaliation. But in the Sermon on the Mount Jesus prescribes forgiving love as the Christian model. It is possible to forgive people who have offend-

ed us but it's hard to forget. When the memories come back we should tell ourselves, each time, that I have already forgiven.

Catholic School Parent Meeting: Catholic education addresses the development of the whole person through spiritual and academic formation based on the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We recall the statement made by the Second Vatican Council, "Holy Mother Church must be concerned with the whole of man's life, even the secular part of it insofar as it has a bearing on his heavenly calling. Therefore she has a role in the progress and development of education." We have 67 students who go to the Catholic School System. On the 6th of March I invite all the parents of these Catholic School students to join me for an hour of prayer and sharing in the Church at 7:00 pm. Each family will be given their voucher for the year 2017- 2018 school year. Hope everyone can make it to the meeting.
