

#### **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity**

John 3:16-18 "God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

Our images of God are often formed early in life. Sadly, those images are of a severe, vengeful God like a policeman waiting to pounce on us for doing something wrong or a judge who takes things away from us as a punishment. Jesus taught of about a God who loves us unconditionally and wants us to discover, accept, develop and use all of the talents, abilities and gifts he gave us for our own benefit and enjoyment, and the benefit and enjoyment of others. God created us to share eternal life with him after a life of being all that he created us to be. Nicodemus, a Pharisee, who came to Jesus in the night so as not to be seen as one of his followers. He had a image of a severe God, but he respected Jesus as a teacher who had come from God. Jesus, speaking of himself in the third person, tells Nicodemus, and through Nicodemus, tells us, of a God who sent his Son into the world to save it, not condemn it. Jesus would leave us to return to the Father, but he left his Spirit to lead us to be all that God created us to be.




**Happy Feast of the Trinity:** The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature, co-equal and co-eternal. Our mind cannot grasp this doctrine which teaches that 1+1+1 = 1 and not 3. But we believe in this Mystery because Jesus, who is God, taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it, and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith. All prayers in the Church begin in the Name of the Holy Trinity and end glorifying the Trinity. All Sacraments are

administered (we are baptized, confirmed, anointed, our sins are forgiven, our marriage is blessed, and our Bishops, priests and deacons are ordained) in the name of the Holy Trinity- We bless ourselves, and the priest blesses us, in the Name of the Holy Trinity abide. Let us have the firm conviction that the Trinitarian God abides in us, that He is the Source of our hope, courage and strength, and that He is our final destination. Let us practice the Trinitarian relationship of love and unity in the family relationships of father, mother, and children because by Baptism we become children of God and members of God's Trinitarian family.

**St Barnabas**: Was a wealthy Jewish Levite. He became a convert to Christianity soon after Pentecost, in the year 29 or 30 AD and sold all his possessions for the benefit of the Church. The name Barnabas, means son of consolation or son of encouragement. It was he who welcomed the converted Soul to Jerusalem and presented him before the Apostles, when they at first found it difficult to believe that their fiercest persecutor had now become an ardent propagator of the faith. However, from his previous acquaintance with Saul, Barnabas knew Saul to be utterly sincere in his convictions. To both these men, the Church, before long, accorded the title of "Apostle". Barnabas was a key figure in evangelization of early Christians in Antioch, Cyprus and Asian Minor. Barnabas is believed to have been stoned to death before the year 61 AD. Ever gentle and conciliatory, and of majestic bearing, he was, next to St Paul, probably one of the most attractive and highly respected figures among the early Christians. The Church honors this Apostle and Martyr on the 11th of June. St Barnabas, pray for us.

I am the Boss: There is an old story about a henpecked husband who went to a psychologist. He was tired of being dominated by his wife. The psychologist told him, "You do not have to accept your wife's bullying. You need to go home right now and let her know that you're your own boss." The husband decided to take the doctor's advice. He went home and slammed the door on the way in. He confronted his wife and said, "From now on you'll do what I say. Get my supper, then go upstairs and lay out my clothes. After I eat, I'm going out with the boys while you stay home. By the way, do you know who is going to tie my tie for me?" "I sure do," said his wife calmly, "the undertaker." Some marriages are filled with conflict. So are some offices. Unfortunately, some Churches are filled with conflict as well. The feast of the Holy Trinity challenges us to cultivate the Trinitarian relationship of love and unity in our families and offices and parishes

**Bishop's Statement on Racism and Civil Unrest:** I join with civic and religious leaders across the United States to pray for peace and healing as our nation faces yet another crisis of racism, violence, and distrust. Yet again we are appalled at the violent death of an unarmed Black man at the hands of police. This has happened all too often in our land; a land that we declare is grounded in justice for all.

I extend my prayers and concern for the family and community of Mr. George Floyd and for the repose of his soul. The violence that led to his death was filmed for all to see and sadly looks all too familiar. As noted by Archbishop José H. Gomez, the president of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Mr. Floyd's death was "senseless and brutal."

I implore all to heed the calls for an end to the violence that has followed this tragedy. Peaceful demonstrators and protestors have a proper and positive place in our society. It is urgent that our communities' leaders listen and commit themselves to concrete actions to right the injustices that racism breeds; the most noteworthy among these being violence toward people of color.

The violence in American cities in recent days is self-destructive and self-defeating. No good can come from violence and destruction. I add my voice to the voices of law enforcement professionals calling for justice. They are rightly ashamed and saddened by recent events. I believe that the vast majority of police men and women desire to serve and protect, and are to be commended for their generous service.

Let us as communities and as a nation now listen to the cries of those burdened every day by the sinful effects of racism. Together we can still build a more just society that will assure life, liberty, and equality for all.
