

The truth about Happiness: Happiness is something that we are all looking for in our own particular way. Our idea of what makes us joyful is greatly influenced by the world around us. People chase money, hoping for a big house with a comfortable bed, yet, 30 percent of people who have it all struggle to sleep at night. People chase fame, not knowing that it cannot appease the empty feeling inside. We work hard for money to provide for our family, Yet a study says that an average family spends only 67 minutes together in a day. We take photos everywhere we go but we do not capture the moment. Another study conducted about happiness say that it is not wealth or fame or assets

that made people healthier and happier, rather it was good relationships- embracing community —that actually kept us happier and healthier. The study showed that those who had fulfilling relationships with their friends and family were happier and healthier than those who did not. St Mary Magdalene: On the 22nd of this month we celebrate the feast of St Mary Magdalene. All the Gospels accord Mary Magdalene a unique place among Jesus' followers. Her surname probably owes its origin to her birthplace, a town called Magdala on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. This Mary who is called Magdalene was freed from seven devils by our Lord. "The sinner" lovingly anointed his feet, and according to St John she was Mary of Bethany who sat at the Lord's feet and listened spellbound to his every word. The Lord's most ardent and loving follower, Mary Magdalene stood with his beloved mother at the foot of the cross, witnessed his burial and was the first to see both the empty tomb and the Risen Lord. St Mary Magdalene pray for us. "When you commit any sin, repent of it at once and resolve to amend. If it is a grievous sin, confess it as soon as possible: (St Alphonus Liguri)

We spent many hours together in prayer and through that process came to understand that to love and forgive unconditionally on a daily basis is the only way a marriage can last". Let us continue to pray for couples that they be strong and faithful to each other and may grow in their love for one another.
